### INFORMATION MEETINGS AND CONFERENCES

UNESCO is convening an Intergovernmental Conference UNISIST 11 in Paris on Scientific and Technological Information for Development, from 28 May to 1 June. The conference will examine the role of information in development, in particular the problems related to the flow and utilization of scientific and technological information.
